AN EXHIBITION BY BRONWYN LACE AND MARCUS NEUSTETTER

Approximately a year after the initiation of the Sutherland Reflections experimental interventions including kite-making and flying activities, as a direct response to the town's social relationship to the nearby observatory and the 2009 International Year of Astronomy, Bronwyn Lace and Marcus Neustetter have found evidence of kiting in their own city of Johannesburg. Their investigations have sparked the need for further interventions and activities informed by narratives and memories of kite-flying in historically displaced neighbourhoods such as Fietas as well as new interventions within contemporary spaces of displacement in the city.

The Exhibition at Goethe on Main presents Lace and Neustetter's personal reflection on these activities in the form of an installation and exhibition, which includes documentation by guest photographers Lien Botha, Mike Carelse and Claire Gritten.

Parts of the exhibition will travel with the artists to Sutherland in the last weeks of 2009, where it aims to inspire new projects and interventions.
